South Pymatuning Township Regular Meeting

The Regular Meeting of the South Pymatuning Township Board of Supervisors was opened at 6:00 p.m. with Supervisors Matthew Chalupka, Chairman, Johnathan Leyshon, Michael Anglin and Solicitor James Nevant present.

The meeting was opened with the pledge to the flag.

The first item of business was opening the Darien Road bid packages. The bid packages were from Russell Standard (\$49,577.04), Youngblood Paving, Inc. (\$29,106.04) and Frank Martuccio Asphalt and Paving, Inc., (\$24,490.76). A motion was made by Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, to accept Frank Martuccio Asphalt and Paving, Inc. as the lowest bidder. The motion was seconded by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and was unanimously accepted. For the record, all bid submissions met specifications.

There were seven residents present.

A motion was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, and seconded by Supervisor, Johnathan Leyshon to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the June 10, 2026, Regular Meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, announced the weather has turned very warm and to check on any elderly neighbors.

The Police Department report was given by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, announced the following approved building permits; Smith, 2776 Gull Lane-rooftop solar panels, Miller, 2767 Anchorage Road-home occupation.

A motion to pay the bills totaling \$111,444.40 and the June payrolls totaling \$68,096.19 was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka and seconded by Supervisor Michael Anglin. The motion was passed unanimously.

There was no correspondence or old business.

A motion by Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, to approve the purchase of a 2025 Ford Police Interceptor from Bill McCandless Ford, Mercer, PA and authorize Keith McKnight to sign for the purchase. Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor, seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

A motion to accept Resolution 6-2026 (amended) An amended Resolution of the Township of South Pymatuning granting approval of a recreational facilities use policy, cost schedule, application form and release, waiver and indemnification agreement; amending Resolution 4-2025 was made by Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, seconded by Michael Anglin and unanimously passed.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, made a motion to hire Penn-Ohio Electric to replace the meter socket at Saranac Drive and Buckeye Drive at a cost of \$1,458.00. Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor, seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

A motion to approve Mid-Atlantic Storage Systems quote of \$25,000.00 for repairs to the water tower and IAG Consulting for professional services of \$16,200.00 related to the water tower repairs was made by Supervisors Chairman, Matthew Chalupka. The motion was seconded by Michael Angling and was unanimously accepted.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, made a motion to hire Mortimer's Excavating Inc. as the low bidder of \$1,640,087.00 for the water line extension on Saranac Drive, Kathy Lane and Buckeye Drive. The motion was seconded by Michael Anglin and unanimously passed.

A motion pursuant to information from Michael and Lori Seinar Roknick, 4408 Thomason Road, Sharpsville, PA; South Township will be trimming trees at the road edge on the Roknick property was made by Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman. The motion was seconded by Johnathan Leyshon and passed unanimously.

Ann Coleman, Mercer County Commissioner, announced the events for Americas 250 Anniversary celebration, the county's new District Attorney Sanders, new President Judge Nesbit, emergency radios, the study/possible merger with Lawrence County 911 and the County property reassessment.

A motion to adjourn the meeting 6:43 p.m. was made by Chairman Matthew Chalupka, seconded by Michael Anglin and was unanimously approved.
